Habitat for Humanity Halton-Mississauga

Since 1999, we have been working together with our corporate, community & construction partners... and marshalling the efforts of legions of volunteers to provide affordable housing options to families in Burlington, Oakville, Mississauga, Milton and Halton Hills. 100% of the money Habitat receives for the repayment of our mortgages is channeled into our Fund for Humanity and utilized in the building or renovating of more homes for more families. Our ReStores in Burlington, Mississauga and Milton are our 'social enterprise'. Net proceeds from them pay for 100% of our administrative and operating costs enabling us to direct 100% of our donations into our build programs.

Twenty years ago, a team of dedicated and forward-thinking volunteers came together with a shared vision.

2019 program highlights

Bold New Housing Strategy

On September 5, 2019, with help from MPs Karina Gould and Pam Damoff, a bold new housing strategy was unveiled joining Habitat HM with Halton Women's Place, Milton Transitional Housing, Halton Multicultural Council, and Summit Housing Outreach Programs that will see the agencies work in collaboration to provide housing to the most vulnerable in our community. Each of the agencies will house clients in at least one of the homes in the 18-unit Queensway multiplex.

Gap - Housing for the Missing Middle

Gap housing is specifically targeted to help families and individuals making a moderate income between \$60,000 to \$100,000. In Mississauga and beyond thousands of individuals fit within this income range. Habitat Halton-Mississauga is currently rolling out a GAP housing option as part of its newest build partnership with the Daniels Corporation for housing located within the Arc Condominiums in Mississauga.

Tiny Homes - Think Small

Thanks to an exciting new partnership with the Milton School Board and the efforts of highly engaged and motivated students enrolled in their Construction program, Habitat Halton-Mississauga has started construction on it's first two tiny houses. Habitat has been working with the MDHS team for the past three years on a number of projects, offering students a practical opportunity for skills training and development and to sample potential career paths.

Habitat Housing Hub

Imagine a six story, hotel-style building with a first floor used as intake, programming and office space for service organizations housed within it. Designed in the spirit of a traditional 'inn', welcoming individuals and families for emergency, transitional and short-stays. In effect, it offers efficient, cost effective and centralized housing support to a broad cross-section of the service and partner agencies with whom which it works.


This successful social enterprise is a Canadian idea that helps local Habitats build more homes and is an environmentally-friendly initiative, diverting high-quality product away from landfills.



ReVive: our exclusive upcycling centre

Typically, **recycling is** all about breaking down old items into their raw material state in order to create new items to save them from going to landfill. But it takes energy and resources to break these down into their rawest form before they can be recycled into new products.

Upcycling is similar to recycling in that it takes something used and converts into a new product. But the big difference is that we don't need a supply chain or to use non-renewable energy to do it. When something is upcycled, the final product can often be of greater value that the original. Or sometimes, upcycling is the result of creative, innovative minds. We have lots of those at Habitat Halton-Mississauga!



A green initiative with a difference

Our ReVive Upcycling program helps us breathe new life into items donated to our ReStores. Our ReVive Center is a fully equipped, multi-purpose product development space designed to offer volunteers and participants the opportunity to explore and experience a variety of DIY, small-scale construction and upcycling projects through hands-on building activities and workshops that recycles, transforms and breathes new life into donated products and materials that would otherwise be sent to landfill. As a green-oriented initiative and the very first of its kind, the ReVive Center is an innovative unique idea that helps us raise funds that support our Habitat for Humanity mission.



kitchen deconstruction diverting construction waste

Real estate experts say that kitchen and bathroom renovations are two of the key things that improve the value of your home. Savvy renovators on a limited budget know that there are ways to update a kitchen without purchasing brand new. Habitat Halton-Mississauga helped nearly 160 families keep their gently used kitchens out of landfill in 2019 and another 160 families upgrade their kitchens affordably. Even better, donors received a charitable tax receipt for the for-sale value of their donation. The proceeds from the sale of kitchens through our ReStores topped \$500,000 in 2019 and helped Habitat achieve its mission in our community.

Our Salvage service is free and it starts with a phone call. Donors can gently remove their kitchens and have them ready for us or Habitat can remove them. Either way, families save money on the cost of removal, disposal fees and help our planet by reducing what is unnecessarily sent to landfill leaving a few more dollars available in the reno budget. And for families making space for new appliances, Habitat welcomes donations of fridges, stoves, dishwashers, microwaves and counter tops.
