ADVOCACY & PARTNERSHIPS

Empowering Families: Our unique housing model has delivered 68 family homes and 15 tiny homes, equaling 83 affordable housing units since 1999. HFHHMD's unique housing model offers a "pathway to home ownership," filling a critical gap in the housing continuum. By providing a hand-up, not a hand-out, we ensure that our families actively participate in a better future for themselves and their children.

Educational Initiatives: Our partnership with local school boards has enabled us to engage 1,200 secondary school students in the hands-on building experiences of 15 Tiny Homes for Indigenous communities through our Youth Skilled Trades Building program. Not only are

we fostering valuable skills in the next generation of builders, but we are also instilling a sense of community service and social responsibility.

Strategic Growth: With an ambitious strategic plan, we are on track to deliver a minimum of 130 new housing units between 2022 and 2032. By 2025, we aim to establish a viable pipeline plan for an additional 70 units, ensuring our impact continues growing exponentially.

Community Engagement: Through meaningful volunteer opportunities, we have mobilized 178 active volunteers in 2023. Alongside many corporate partners, these dedicated individuals are making a significant difference in the lives of those in need.

SOCIAL IMPACT 2023

Our families pay an affordable mortgage based on household income. Since Covid, we have seen our total families' incomes double which we attribute to the security and safety of their Habitat homes.

MAKING AN IMPACT

MISSION 2023: BY THE NUMBERS



- 23** Developer-built affordable units were added to the pipeline
- 1** Family paid their mortgage in full - marking a significant step towards financial stability and community empowerment
- 5** Families are working towards completion of their 500 volunteer hours with dedication ceremonies planned for 2024-25
- 178** Volunteers contributed their time, skills and experience
- 14,723** Hours of volunteer time contributed to supporting programs and events
- \$922,902** Raised to build more homes in more communities for local families
- 5** Tiny Homes were completed and successfully delivered to Indigenous Communities
- 5** Additional Tiny Homes are being built by youth for completion in 2024

THE NEED FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING



- 64%** Of residents in the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) express concerns about affording the community they currently reside in
- 48%** Of residents in the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) are worried about their ability to cover mortgage or rent expenses in the next 12 months.
- 60%** Of GTA residents worry about having to sacrifice other basic needs—such as food, clothing, living essentials, and education—to afford rent or mortgage payments
